The Professional Research Assistant (PRA) for the Red Lodge Clearinghouse (RLCH) Project at the Natural Resources Law Center will provide primary support for the Red Lodge Clearinghouse, a website supporting collaborative natural resource management. See <http://www.redlodgeclearinghouse.org>. This will encompass independent research and writing on natural resources law and policy issues and collaborative resource management, focusing primarily on the Intermountain West. Responsibilities may also include drafting grant applications and preparing reports on research activities, facilitating the publication of research on the RLCH website, and assisting the Center's Director by helping to develop and participate in conferences, workshops, and publications related to other Center grants and activities. The RLCH PRA will be responsible for coordinating a revisioning of the RLCH project and day-to-day implementation of the project vision. Responsibilities will include management of the RLCH website content and newsletter, research and writing for the website, hiring and supervision of students (Red Lodge Scholars) to assist with research and writing, soliciting and editing guest submissions, website postings of research using a content management system, and promoting the RLCH website usage. The successful candidate will be chosen based on his/her education and experience with western natural resource issues, collaborative resource management, and community-based conservation; understanding and appreciation of the RLCH vision; research and writing ability; computer skills, and ability to communicate with a wide variety of potential RLCH constituents. Minimum qualifications are a bachelors degree and two years of relevant experience. A graduate degree is preferred. Compensation will be competitive and commensurate with the successful applicant's experience and will include a generous package of benefits. Available salary range is \$35,000 - \$50,000, plus benefits.

The Center will begin reviewing applications on May 25, 2007 and will continue until a successful applicant is selected. The University of Colorado at Boulder is committed to diversity and equality in education and employment. We welcome applications from women and minorities and from people with diverse backgrounds and interests.
